1. Your bus arrives at the bus stop every 10 minutes, but you never remember to check the bus schedule.

(Try to think about this problem without considering probability density functions.)

- (a) What is the probability that that when you get to the stop, you have to wait at 1 minutes or less?
 - (b) What is the probability that that when you get to the stop, you have to wait at 9 minutes or less?
 - (c) If you go to the bus stop for 10 days, what would you expect your average wait time to be?
2. Consider a group of patients that have been treated for an acute disease, such as cancer. Let X be the number of years a person lives after receiving the treatment (X is the “survival time”). The continuous random variable, X , will have an exponential probability density function. In other words, the pdf and cdf will be:

$$f(x) = \begin{cases} 0 & \text{if } x < 0 \\ \frac{1}{\lambda}e^{-x/\lambda} & \text{if } x \geq 0 \end{cases} \quad F(x) = \begin{cases} 0 & \text{if } x < 0 \\ 1 - e^{-x/\lambda} & \text{if } x \geq 0 \end{cases}$$

- (a) If the average survival time is 10 years, find λ .
- (b) If the median survival time is 10 years, find λ .
- (c) If the probability that a patient survives 5 years is 90%, find λ .
